EXTRAS: The fees shown in the table do not include charges for heating, the services of a vergers, music (e.g. organist, choir), bells, and flowers, which are fixed by the Parochial Church Council. The 2020 Parochial Fees Table changed the apportionment of the fee for a funeral service at a cemetery or crematorium so that the PCC no longer received any part of the fee. In response, the WDBF issued the following 'direction':

- The WDBF will permit every PCC that processes a fee for a funeral service at a cemetery or crematorium to retain £30 of that fee before forwarding the remainder to the WDBF. This will effectively leave the PCC in the same position as it was prior to the fees change in 2020.'

Glossary:

PTO - Permission to Officiate, a licence given to clergy by the diocesan bishop after DBS checks and safeguarding training. PTO clergy are often retired but not always.
* Non PTO Clergy - including rectors, vicars, team rectors, team vicars, priests-in-charge, associate/assistant priest/minister/vicar/rector, curate, assistant curate.
* PTO Clergy - those who have applied to and been granted Permission to Officiate by the diocesan bishop, a 3 year licence which must be renewed.
