

PARISH MISSION ACTION PLANS (pMAPs)

How will the process work this time around? We will again be using the steps of **Review, Plan and Act** to consider what God is calling you to focus on at parish/benefice level.

- In the **Review Phase**, you will be looking to see how God has been using your plans to impact our neighbourhoods and networks. What stories do you have to tell of what has happened?
- In the **Plan Phase** you will be looking at what existing objectives you want to carry forward from your last pMAP and which ones you want to add. One of the key challenges of the Plan Phase it to decide which of all the many objectives you *should* focus on for the next 3 to 5 years.
- Finally, the **Act Phase**, when you seek to make these dreams a reality under the direction and resourcing of the Holy Spirit.

This is the journey your PCC is about to embark upon, so please pray for them as they seek to discern God's leading in the busyness of parish life.

If you are part of a benefice, you will be asked to create a Benefice MAP (bMAP), one that all the parishes involved can sign up to. Of course, each parish may still have one or two specific objectives just for them.

As a Diocese we want to see each of our parishes and deaneries flourishing as they Live the Mission of Jesus in the different contexts we live and work in.


Mission Action Planning is a key tool in enabling us to do this. We have plans at archdeaconry, deanery and parish levels which we are working at together, coordinating one with the other so that we have a comprehensive plan for growth for the diocese.

This time around we are simply renewing our **Parish Mission Action Plans (pMAPs)** in the light of the deanery and archdeaconry plans. If your parish/benefice already has one in place you do not need to start from scratch! However, this process provides a good opportunity to review what has been happening and where the opportunities are for the next 3 to 5 years.

If you do not have a pMAP in place then the process will guide you through what you need to do.

Each deanery has already produced a **Deanery Mission Action Plan (dMAP)** which you will need to refer to as you review your pMAP.

We also have the **Archdeaconry Priorities (aMAP)** which *may* impact your parish/benefice too.
