## LOOKING FORWARD TO FEBRUARY

Bishop Tim will be on study leave for February and March.

In early February Bishop Tim will be making a brief visit to Nairobi to meet with three new post holders: the Development Officer for Discipleship and Education in CAPA (the Council for Anglican Provinces in Africa), the General Secretary of CMS Africa and the General Secretary of Church Army Africa. He will be discussing the development of Further and Higher Education institutions within Africa, and the establishment of a new Chaplaincy programme for training Chaplains who will work in a range of institutions within the African context: education, hospitals, the Armed Forces and prisons. These developments are of great significance for Winchester's Companion Links in Eastern Africa: the Provinces of Burundi, DR Congo, Rwanda and Uganda.
