What is the CMF?

The Common Mission Fund is the way in which we all contribute to the cost of our shared mission and ministry. This money is crucial to our ability to provide clergy and lay ministry across our benefices, parishes, and churches.

We ask every parish to contribute financially and it is only through those donations that we are able to affect the mission we are called to.

The CMF is a key way in which we can all respond to the endless generosity we have experienced in the person and work of Jesus Christ; we are able to play our part – we can meet the challenge and sustain the ministry that we are called to across the Diocese of Winchester.

It costs £11.3m per year to run our diocese

How does it work?

It costs nearly £11.3m a year to run the Diocese of Winchester. Most of which is spent funding our clergy as they lead our local mission and ministry across the different communities that make up our diocese.

It is a fact that some parishes are better off than others. Some communities find it difficult to pay the £70,000 that it costs to support a parish priest every year without help. Without the Common Mission Fund many parishes and benefices could not afford a dedicated priest.

Thankfully, we have each other to share the load. We ask those that can afford to give more to do so, which in turn supports neighbouring parishes.

The Common Mission Fund is a "Kingdom Principle": Parishes give according to their potential so that all may receive according to their need.

Tadley North St Mary

2020 was an unprecedented year across our diocese. In Tadley North St Mary, the parish decided to give over and above what was asked of them to support the wider picture of ministry across the Basingstoke Deanery and across the diocese, which the Revd Canon Richard Harlow believes is important:

"We were aware that many parishes took a terrible hit financially due to the pandemic and that the Common Mission Fund is a highly effective way of supporting our colleagues in other parts of the diocese, so we resolved to contribute more than our request. In former years, we have been the beneficiaries of the generosity of others, and this year it was our privilege to give a little more. We are about to embark on major building works, so this decision was costly to us. but we see CMF as the first claim on our income and giving over our request helps us become the generous people of God that we aspire to be."

Where does the money come from?

There are sometimes assumptions that the church is rich; living off investments and historic reserves, but this is not true in the Diocese of Winchester.

In our diocese, it is our parishes that ensure our parishes exist. The Common Mission Fund funnels our collective resource so that ministry is assured, and our priests are supported. 80% of what it takes to run the Diocese of Winchester comes from the CMF.

Without the committed contributions from parishes and individuals, the Common Mission Fund would not exist, and parish life would look very different across our region.

Where does the money go?

We donate to our local parish with the knowledge that what we give is used to fund local mission and ministry as well as the day to day operations necessary to keep our parishes and churches functioning effectively.

As part of a commitment to our shared vision, a proportion of our giving to our local church is sent on by each parish to the

diocese, where the money goes on to support churches in Hampshire and East Dorset.

The CMF funds every minister across our diocese, and the Diocesan Office Team, which is there to offer practical support to bolster the effectiveness of our parish life. The CMF contributes nothing to the direct costs of our Bishops or our Cathedral.
